POSITION: Housing Support Worker FT

LOCATION: Men's Shelter

Na-Me-Res (Native Men's Residence) located in Toronto, is a diverse, multi-service organization. Through a culture-based approach that addresses the holistic needs of its clients, Na-Me-Res' mission is to provide temporary, transitional, and permanent housing to Indigenous men experiencing homelessness in Toronto, while providing outreach and support services to the broader Indigenous homeless population.

MAIN FUNCTION:

To provide confidential case management services including addressing the basic needs of clients providing supports which assist clients to affect a life away from homelessness toward a more self-sufficient lifestyle.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Identify type of housing needs including shelter, transitional, supportive, long term care facilities, permanent residential settings, etc.
- Assist and support clients to complete housing applications, to reactivate existing applications and other applications as required
- Support and accompany clients to housing and other appointments and services when appropriate
- In partnership with clients, develop an after-care plan which included follow-up services
- Provide eviction prevention and intervention service to clients whose housing security is at risk
- Develop workshops for residents on how to: find, apply and maintain housing
- Other duties as identified by supervisor

SKILLS REQUIRED:

- Familiarity with housing resources in Toronto
- Ability to prioritize and manage multiple jobs effectively
- Ability to work under pressure and to meet deadlines
- Able to communicate effectively Good oral and written communication skills
- Knowledge and ability to work with computers
- Ability to write and communicate clearly and effectively

EDUCATION & EXPERIENCE:

- Post-Secondary education in a Social Work or related discipline and/or relevant work experience
- Several years of experience in a similar setting
- Successful candidate required to provide a police check as a condition of employment
- Experience working with a diverse population
- Knowledge of Indigenous culture is an asset
- Understanding of Indigenous culture and history particularly as it relates to the disproportionate number of Indigenous people who are homeless
